### 1 Corinthians 1 (31 Verses)

# Verses 1-31

- 1. Paul, called to be an apostle of Jesus Christ through the will of God, and Sosthenes our brother,
- 2. To the church of God which is at Corinth, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, with all who in every place call on the name of Jesus Christ our Lord, both
- theirs and ours:
- 3. Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
- 4. I thank my God always concerning you for the grace of God which was given to you by Christ Jesus,
- 5. that you were enriched in everything by Him in all utterance and all knowledge,
- 6. even as the testimony of Christ was confirmed in you,
- 7. so that you come short in no gift, eagerly waiting for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ,
- 8. who will also **confirm** you to the end, that you may be blameless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- 9. God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.
- 10. Now I plead with you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment.
- 11. For it has been **declared** to me concerning you, my brethren, by those of Chloe's household, that there are contentions among you.

### 1 Corinthians 2 (16 Verses)

- 1. <u>And I, brethren, when I came to you, did not come with excellence of speech or of wisdom declaring to you the testimony of God.</u>
- 2. *For I determined* not to know anything among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified.
- 3. <u>I was</u> with you in weakness, in **fear**, and in much **trembling**.
- 4. <u>And my</u> speech and my preaching were not with **persuasive** words of human wisdom, but in **demonstration** of the Spirit and of power,
- 5. *that your* faith should not be in the wisdom of men but in the power of God.
- 6. <u>However, we</u> speak wisdom among those who are **mature**, yet not the wisdom of this age, nor of the rulers of this age, who are coming to nothing.
- 7. <u>But we speak</u> the wisdom of God in a mystery, the hidden wisdom which God **ordained** before the **ages** for our glory,

### 1 Corinthians 5 (13 Verses)

- 1. <u>It is actually reported</u> that there is sexual immorality among you, and such sexual immorality as is not even named among the **Gentiles** that a man has his father's wife!
- 2. <u>And you are puffed up</u>, and have not rather **mourned**, that he who has done this deed might be **taken** away from among you.
- 3. <u>For I indeed</u>, as **absent** in body but present in spirit, have already judged (as though I were present) him who has so done this deed.
- 4. <u>In the</u> name of our Lord Jesus Christ, when you are **gathered** together, **along** with my spirit, with the power of our Lord Jesus Christ,
- 5. <u>deliver</u> such a one to **Satan** for the **destruction** of the flesh, that his spirit may be saved in the day of the Lord Jesus.
- 6. <u>Your</u> **glorying** is not good. Do you not know that a **little** leaven **leavens** the **whole** lump?
- 7. <u>Therefore purge</u> out the old leaven, that you may be a **new** lump, since you **truly** are unleavened. For indeed Christ, our **Passover**, was **sacrificed** for us.
- 8. <u>Therefore let us</u> keep the **feast**, not with old leaven, nor with the leaven of **malice** and **wickedness**, but with the unleavened **bread** of **sincerity** and **truth**.
- 9. <u>I wrote</u> to you in my **epistle** not to keep company with sexually immoral people.
- 10. <u>Yet</u> I certainly did not **mean** with the sexually immoral people of this world, or with the covetous, or extortioners, or idolaters, since then you would **need** to go out of the world.

- 3. <u>Do you not know that we</u> shall judge angels? How much more, things that **pertain** to this life?

- Note 2 Frequently Paul poses questions of the form "Do you not know...". When the definition states "No answer given" this does not mean that the truth claim has no answer, only that we don't know for sure whether or not the Corinthian believers knew it to be true.
